Yokohama Solo × Duo <Compétition>+ Application Requirements

Rules & Regulations

(Division)

1. The Solo \times Duo Division : Works of Choreographers for one or two dancers.

2. The Group Division : Works of Choreographers for three or more dancers.

(Conditions for Registration)

For both divisions, applicants must meet these conditions:

1. Choreographers who have had a work performed at least once

2.Choreographers with a solid foundation in dance and who are well versed in the state of dance in their own countries and throughout the world

3.For Solo \times Duo Division only: Choreographers whose work was first performed within the past 10 years.

4.For Group Division only: Choreographers whose work was first performed within the past 15 years.

*Choreographers who have already won the French Embassy Prize for Young Choreographers or the Yokohama Prize for a Brilliant Future (formerly the Yokohama Arts Foundation Prize) are eligible to apply in another division.

(DVD/VHS Contents & Format)

1. The work submitted must be a completed new work or choreographed in 2006-2007, with no constraints on its performance.

2. Presentation time is a work of less than 30 minutes.

*For Finalists ONLY: Contents of your piece should be appropriate within the confines of the Japanese laws in the Competition.

(Registration Fee)

1. Free Registration Fee.

2. Travel to and living expenses in Yokohama are responsibility of the finalists.

XAll finalists of the Competition, including finalists from overseas, will be asked pull in the audiences.

(How to apply)

1. Download the application form from the website or telephone to ask that the application form be sent to you. Fill it out and send it in, with all the additional materials required.

2. Documents must be written in Japanese or English.

(A presentation document)

Please note that failure to submit all the required application materials will disqualify your application from consideration. Application materials cannot be returned.

The following materials are required:

1. An application form

2. Two photographs (a portrait photograph of the choreographer and a photograph showing the work)

• Photographs may be either black and white or color; permission for their use shall have been obtained from the photographer.

• Indicate, on the reverse of each photograph, the name of the work, the name of the choreographer, and the name of the photographer.

3. A copy of a poster or flyer from a previous performance

4. A DVD/VHS of your work and other explanatory materials about it

• The DVD/VHS should minimize the use of the special artistic effects possible in video art.

• The DVD/VHS must contain a recording of only one work

• The DVD/VHS must be labeled with the name of the work, the name of the choreographer, and the length of the recording.

• The DVD/VHS should be accompanied by the DVD/VHS Information Sheet at the end of this application form.

(Dead line for Registration)

Applications must be received by Tuesday, July 31, 2007.

Jury

The judging committee will be dance experts from France and Japanese experts in a variety of genre.

Prizes

The choreographers judged to be the best will receive the following prizes:

• French Embassy Prize for Young Choreographers (Solo × Duo Division only)

The prize entitles the winner to

- Six months' study in France.
- Opportunities to perform
- Yokohama Prize for Brilliant Future (Group Division only)

- A public performance at the Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse No. 1
- Opportunities to perform
- July Prize (Selected by both the Solo × Duo and the Group Division)

In this competition, for rising new choreographers who are creating distinctive dances, we place great value on expression within the creative activity of choreography.
