The Yokohama Dance Collection R is pleased to announce the winners of the 2009 Yokohama Solo x Duo <Compétition> +, the competition component of this contemporary dance festival, one of the largest contemporary dance festivals in Asia. These awards are the gateway to achievement on the global stage for promising young choreographers.

This year, we had a record 192 entries from 14 countries. The 15 finalists were selected by screening the videos they submitted, then presented their work at the festival. After a rigorous judging process, the jury announced its decision, awarding prizes to the following choreographers. Again this year, the awards include the MASDANZA Prize, which carries the right to perform at MASDANZA in Spain. We look forward to brilliant futures for all these innovative young dance artists!

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What is the MASDANZA Prize?

Natalia Medina Santana, director of the MASDANZA dance festival, which is held in Gran Canaria, Spain, first participated in Yokohama Dance Collection R2006 in an effort to uncover talented Asian dancers. Since then, the exciting choreographers that her explorations at Yokohama Dance Collection have discovered have been invited to MASDANZA, to great success. In 2006, *anna* won the MASDANZA Grand Prix in the choreography section and the Audience Prize. In 2007, *Ayako Hamaguchi* won Third Prize in the choreography section and *Lee Sun-A* won the Second Prize in the solo contest and the Audience Prize. In 2008, *Miki Hoesi* won the Best Dancer Prize, *Hyauk-Jin Geon* took Second Prize in the solo section, and *Park Eun Young* won Second Prize in the choreography section. The prizes they have earned at MASDANZA attest to the superb talents of Dance Collection R prizewinners.
